



Volunteerism at St. Albans Family



As many of you know, my Mom, Donna Taber, was a teacher in many roles here and then Head of School over the course of her 20 years at St. Albans. I think that if she were here today my mom would be a little uncomfortable with much, if any, mention of her. She'd probably and rightfully point out that she was but one in a long line of distinguished individuals who have so capably led this school over the past 50 years.

I think she would be most proud of her grandkids and of the relationships she enjoyed with the wonderful teachers and staff and the opportunity to help educate so many who continue to make our world a better place. More than a few of those former students of hers have children of their own here at St. Albans. She'd also be very proud of her daughter-in-law, my wife Michele, and the many contributions she has made as a former SAPA Board President and current Executive Board Trustee. When I saw the date for this event on the calendar back at the beginning of the school year, I had to smile. May 3rd. Today would have been my mom's 77th birthday.

In fact, the last time I spoke of her this much in this building was at her Memorial Service more than 14 years ago. The message was a letter to Sami who was then only six months old. In that letter were two lessons, the two biggest take aways that are to this day the blessed messages I learned. The first I learned on the monkey bars as a toddler: "Hang on!" No matter how hard things seem, no matter how afraid you might be of falling, you can and must hang on. And even if you do fall it'll probably be fine.

Number two: Choices. The opportunity to choose is its greatest reward. The harder and smarter you work, often the more choices you'll be able to make for

I had the opportunity to have lunch with a fellow member of my class of '82 just this week. An Ivy League graduate, and an amazing guy. He as much as anyone I have met embodies those two messages from my Mom. Now, he never had my mom as a teacher, but his younger brother, class of '83 who was also there and a dear friend, didhe said my mom introduced him to bad grades. I will say that, like his brother, he graduated from high school with better than a 4.0.

So where am I going with all of this? Well, to the parents, grandparents, and special friends who support St. Albans students past, present and future, your choice to give your children the gift of a St. Albans experience is your gift to their futures.

Remembered for her concern for the needs of others

Hundreds of school children, who are now living across California and this nation, were touched by the love, care, and patient mentoring of Loretta Pauline (Steichen) Gaunt. All, including their parents, will agree that Loretta displayed an indomitable spirit with a smile, a never-ending sense of humor, and a steady and confident passion for helping the children of St. Albans Country Day School in Roseville, California, grow from pre-school students to young adults headed off to high school.

Loretta, most recently of Lansdale, Pennsylvania, passed away peacefully Saturday, December 14, 2013, at home. She was preceded in death by her loving husband, Allen R. Gaunt. Born December 15, 1935, in Tipton, Kansas, Loretta was a daughter of the late Eugene and Theresa (Becker) Steichen. She was one of ten children.

Loretta moved from Tipton, Kansas to northern California in 1966 where she met her husband. She retired from her position as a Technical Writer at Mc-Clellan Air Force Base in 1976. In 1987, she founded and began serving as the Director of the Extended Day Care Program at St. Albans Country Day School in Roseville, California. During her fulfilling 17 years at this school, until her retirement in 2004, she dedicated her positive spirit, loving guidance and boundless energy to mentoring and enhancing the lives of hundreds of children, becoming a respected professional and lasting friend of the parents of those children.

The Roseville Rotary Club awarded her with Teacher-of-the-Month honors in February 1995. The day care center was subsequently named the Loretta Gaunt Extended Day Care Center in her honor. During her in time in California, she was a fixture in her community and volunteered countless hours for the Rocklin Soccer Club, SS. Peter and Paul Church in Rocklin, and St. Albans Country Day School.

After retiring from St. Albans in 2004, she moved to Lansdale, Pennsylvania to live near her son's family. Not content to stay at home, she helped care for her grandchildren, enthusiastically attended their many activities, volunteered at Corpus Christi Catholic Church, and kindled great friendships within her community.

Loretta's favorite past times were spending time with her grandchildren, reading, helping others, and cooking German feasts for friends and family. She also enjoyed playing and watching sports.

Loretta is survived by her son, Michael and wife Christine, of Lansdale; two grandchildren, Madeleine and Molly Gaunt; and six siblings, Crescentia Gasper, Mary Ann Thummel, Helena Gasper, and Caroline Ellenz all of Tipton, KS, Charles Steichen of Placentia, CA. and Eileen Steichen of Oroville. WA; and several nieces, nephews, and cousins.

In addition to her parents and husband, Loretta was preceded in death by two brothers, Eugene and Raymond; and a sister, Margaret Brummer.

Loretta was a beloved member of our St Albans family. We were all so lucky to have known her and St. Albans is a better place because of her. Alumni parent Barbara Orth Montag wrote a sentiment shared by many:

"I am beyond saddened. She was such an amazing loving person. I thank God my kids were lucky enough to know and appreciate her. She made it ok to have the kids go to daycare...no parent guilt! Homework done, kids fed and all were loved. She will be greatly




