Longtime St. Albans Staff Members Honored



Last summer, treasured St. Albans employees Mike and Lucy Hurley retired after working an incredible 38 years on our school campus.

In their honor, the drop-off circle was named "Hurley Way" for the year by one grateful alumni family.

Lucy Hurley's mother, Barbara DeNike, taught at St. Albans from 1967-1983. Lucy graduated from St. Albans in 1969 and returned to campus in 1981 to begin working as a noon yard duty employee. Her husband Mike followed the next year as St. Albans' maintenance custodian and yard duty employee.

For the next 37 plus years, the Hurleys were a nearconstant presence on campus, and well-known by all our alumni and their families.

Former student (and current St. Albans parent) Bert Lefty often joked that Mr. Hurley was the school's earliest form of Day Care. "When I had to wait for a ride after school, I would follow Mr. Hurley around school, helping him clean classrooms."



So when Bert's family made the winning bid on *Name The Circle* in last year's Pleasures of the Palate auction, the Lefty family decided to honor the Hurleys by naming it *Hurley Way*.

Bert's wife, Deirdre Lefty, says the decision was made easy with the help of their three daughters, who also happen to be students at St. Albans.

"Generations of families have been blessed by the humble kindness of the Hurleys. They were always another special aspect of the St. Albans community," she said.

Mike and Lucy were touched by the commemorative gesture. "I loved working and helping out at St. Albans for 37 years - though the years went by too fast," says Mike. "We feel really honored by the Lefty family and the street sign."
